Dear Marcin

The Municipality of Copenhagen has forwarded your request to the state forest authority. The reason being that the larger green areas around Copenhagen where orienteering is happening, is under management of the state forest. In these forests, we have multiple Permanent Orienteering Courses (POC) but I can not provide information on parks within the city as these are under municipal management. However, I believe that POCs are mainly placed in our forest areas rather than in the city parks.

In the Danish state forests, access is allowed outside roads and paths. Therefore, it is difficult to distinguish any impact from POC from that of other users. However, there has been no evidence to suggest, that the POCs has caused any critical damage to nature. It is worth noting that in the management of organized events we have a system of "nature zones" where runs with non-permanent routes can not happen. In addition, parts of each forest, has areas where organized activity is not permitted. Finally, all larger events has to submit an application/booking, which is then assessed.
